Kevin McCully, PhD, FACSM, NAK is a professor in the Kinesiology Department at the University of Georgia. His research focus includes enhancing skeletal muscle and vascular function in people with chronic injuries and illnesses. Dr. McCully developed noninvasive methods of studying muscle injury, muscle metabolism, muscle blood flow, and muscle fatigue that are appropriate for clinical populations.

Dr. McCully's presentation will review changes in muscle strength, endurance and injury susceptibility after spinal cord injury (SCI). Methods of improving function with electrical stimulation will be reviewed, followed by a discussion of the technical aspects of assessing strength, endurance, and injury susceptibility.
