SUBSTITUTIONS / TRANSFERS: Registrants wishing to transfer their registration must submit a written request to memberservices@ ACRM.org. Instructional Courses are non-transferable. A substitution fee of \$249 USD will be charged against the original registration on transfer requests received before I September 2020. No substitutions will be made on or after I September 2020. Those who register as non-members retain their 6-month ACRM membership.

CONFERENCE CANCELLATION: Registrants wishing to cancel their registration and receive a refund for items other than Instructional Courses must submit a written request to memberservices@ACRM.org. Instructional Courses are non-refundable. A cancellation fee of \$249 USD will be charged on cancellation requests received on or before 31 May 2020 and the balance remaining will be refunded. On or after I June 2020, a cancellation fee of \$249 USD or 50% of registration paid, whichever is greater, will be charged and the balance paid will be refunded.
