What are Person-Centered Measurement Principles?

We are guided by the American Institutes for Research Patient-Centered Measurement Principles:

- **Person-Driven:** Goals, preferences, & priorities drive what is measures
- **Holistic:** Measurement recognizes the patients are whole people with a life history within and outside of the health system
- **Transparent:** Patients and families have access to the same data as providers and understand how data is used for clinical decision-making
- **Comprehensible & Timely:** Patients and/or families get timely, easy-to-understand information
- **Co-created:** Patients and/or families are equal partners in measure development and have decision-making authority
